## 2002 Printer's Row Book Fair

Over the weekend of June 1 and 2, 2002, the class sponsored a space at the Printer's Row Book Fair. 10 First Volumes, 7 videos and 2 Bible Study Kits were placed in addition to free booklet packets which were given out in English, Spanish and Polish.

In the past we had high winds and rain to deal with, but this weekend the weather was relatively good right up to 5:00 Sunday, when the rains finally came...an hour before regular closing time of the fair. There was a brief moment of excitement when the dumpster near us became engulfed in flames and the Chicago Fire Department came out and put it out. Nothing like smoking rubbish to fill the air and blend with the aroma of charcoal pits, hamburgers, popcorn and Starbucks coffee!

The conversations were a little more scattered apart, but still worthy of the effort. One of the men assigned to cleaning up and looked over the material. He asked some questions and walked away. He returned later with a handful of change...probably 65 cents or less and wanted an extra free booklet packet, giving the change as a donation. When asked if he would like the DPA book, he said yes, but he only had the change in his hand. We gave him the book for the change in his hand and he was so pleased. I noticed him reading it when I saw him later down the block. (I learned a lesson from Br. Rick Cunningham at the Oakland County Fair. When people would say they didn't have enough money for the book, he'd reply that he'd sell them the book for the change that was in their pocket. He often placed a volume for 25-75 cents, but the recipient was usually so tickled pink to have the book they were willing to give their last amount of change...even their bus fare home...to buy the book. It was like the widow's mite and it is still a good lesson in today's witness efforts.)

A young woman came in search of a better understanding of the Bible. Her interest had just recently been rekindled and she didn't know where to start in her search of understanding. She seemed to appreciate the layout of the First Volume and listened with attention and was glad to buy it.

A lawyer came by and bought a kit for a friend. A man with a video camera wanted to video tape our conversation re the history of the Bible Student movement and the transition after Brother Russell's death. He seemed aware of the differences between us and the Jehovah Witnesses. Another man recognized the literature and said he had the volumes, but they were called Millennial Dawns. He wanted our card so he could get more information on literature that is available. A woman from a concession two spaces away stopped and bought a volume. A man came and bought one of each video to give as gifts. One man leaned against the tree at the end of the table and moved one of our signs. I said, "Now you've done it! You'll just have to buy a book!" We explained the book and he bought one!

We don't know which may have benefited most from our being there. Possibly it was the young woman who picked up a Polish free booklet packet for her mother-in-law at home who only spoke Polish who would benefit from the message of Truth. I'm glad we were there and look forward to doing it again.
