2008 Printer's Row Book Fair June 7th and 8th

This year's PRBF witness project had a number of firsts. Br. Ed and Sr. Rachel Bushlus served on Saturday with Sr. Alys Schneider. Sr. Lynn Rose served on Sunday morning with Sr. Evelyn Shepherd. This is in addition to other returning Brethren: Br. Erwin Kalinski, Br. Bob. Giovannoni and myself, Br. Mark Kandel.

With the recent publishing of the Chinese DPA in Mandarin, we were able to offer this for the first time. The location of the PRBF is in downtown Chicago, relatively close to the Chinatown district. It is always an interesting challenge and thrill to be able to place a First Volume that is in a foreign language that you can't speak or even read. It just expands the range that the Truth can be given as a witness. We've offered the Polish and Spanish DPA in the past. The subjects are in the same order as the English. This year three Chinese Volumes were placed.

The world of VHS tapes is fading away. Most people have DVD players, but fewer and fewer VHS players are out there. With this in mind we have been offering VHS tapes we have in stock at 50 cents each and still they move slowly. In some cases they are added free to the shopping bag of someone buying a book.

VCD's can be played on a DVD player or in a computer. There are variety of subjects...many of the VHS tapes have been replaced by this format. These were placed at \$1 each, but as with all the literature placed, the price was never the key reason for being there and some were given away. Bible Students Publications supplied a number of VCD's from stock over runs or that had minor flaws on disc printing.

One of the "specials" was to offer the Studies in the Scriptures set at the "Fair" price of \$5 instead of the normal price of \$15. The choice was given for either the 7-in-1 or the 6 Volume Set. We recently received a number of 6 Volume Sets donated by the West Suburban Bible Students to be used in witness work. We will continue to offer these as long as the supply lasts.

The opportunities for witnessing were somewhat dampened by another first... rain... and when it rained, it really rained hard. This affected the tail end of Saturday and totally washed out Sunday afternoon. Surprisingly, very little literature was lost or damaged. I don't recall ever seeing lightening shoot down the street at eye level before. (I guess that's a sort of first, too.) Or having winds so strong that one of the huge tents in the center of the street was blown to the curb...and these tents are weighted down by 55 gallon drums, one at each corner! Sr. Evelyn, Sr. Lynn and myself were soaked to the literal skin in a very short time...umbrellas were useless as protection (another sort of first). The wind just blew them apart.

When the sun was out, the people came. "Free-Bees" (the booklet packets in a baggie) were free to all that wanted one or two or three. This year we also had the Spanish version of the "How to Study the Bible," so we had another first...the Spanish Free-Bee Packet! It had the Spanish "How to Study the Bible," a Spanish booklet and a Spanish tract in the packet.

Some public remembered us from years' past. I think this was our 12th year at this activity, and we've been within 50 feet of the same location. The Tribune Company sponsors the fair and their staff is very helpful, the public is specialized...book people, our neighbors are always friendly. The atmosphere is an excellent opportunity for witnessing and the brethren that participate always go away blessed and looking forward to next year. It is an honor to serve the Lord in this capacity.

We also appreciate the various Brethren that are behind the scenes in being willing to serve and the Brethren that donated literature, material and funds from their pocket to subsidize expenses. The Lord provides in so many ways.
