The Printer's Row Lit Fest is the largest free outdoor literary event in the Midwest. It draws more than 125,000 book lovers and over 200 booksellers from across the country annually. We have enjoyed having a table of Truth literature at Printer's Row for about twelve years.

I arrived a little early because Br. Mark had been called out to work and was not able to take his morning shift. Bros. Bob and Erwin were actively involved. The tarp was along the back of the table because of occasional showers needing fast action to protect the literature.

Sr. Claudia and Sr. Dorchen soon appeared and we began our afternoon shift. We each had interesting discussions.

One man I talked to was Jewish and we immediately got into a discussion on Rashi's commentary on the Tanakh and Talmud. ("Rashi" is an acronym for **Ra**bbi **Sh**lomo **Y**itzahaki, a French rabbi who lived from 1040-1105. He is considered the "father" of commentaries on the Talmud and Tanakh.) Thankfully, I was familiar with Rashi because of listening to Israel National Radio. More thankfully, after some discussion, this gentleman accepted the DVD "Israel in Bible Prophecy" and a "Time to Favor Zion" booklet. I explained we were Christians and believed that God had brought Israel back to their homeland and they would never be removed again. I also quoted scriptures about Israel's future role in being the light to all the nations, bringing them into a covenant relationship with God through their Messiah. He did not object and gladly took the material.

Another girl came up to the table wearing a Jewish Star of David necklace. I asked if she were Jewish. She said she was a Jewish Baptist—her mother was a Baptist and her father was Jewish. After a brief discussion, she also took the "Israel in Bible Prophecy" DVD and a "Time to Favor Zion" booklet.

I recognized a few people who stopped to talk from previous years. It is always encouraging to know people remember us from year to year and even look for us. One man came up and bought one of every DVD. He said he had purchased the 7-in-One last year and, actually, I remembered him from last year. He also took one of everything on the literature rack (newsletters and magazines) to read when traveling on the bus. He was so excited he gave me a huge hug before he left.

Another man was drawn to the "Truth about Hell" DVD...saying he could never believe that a loving God would torment anyone in flames for eternity. (What a great opening that was!!!)

Another man took some literature and went into detail of how he spent seven years printing the Lithuanian Bible, the greatest work of his lifetime.

Several people were drawn to the "Creation vs. Evolution" DVD. Also the "Where Was God on 9/11?" DVD...they were interested in why God permits evil. We were so happy we could share the answers with them.

The last hour we felt rain drops again and heeded the warning. We gradually began putting the material in the plastic bins under the table, and by the time the tarp was tied down, the drops had not diminished. We went to the car ½ hour early, had our prayer of thanksgiving and prayed a blessing on each person we had spoken to and the seeds of Truth planted. I then drove Sr. Dorchen and Sr. Claudia to Union Station where we parted, with thankful and happy hearts to have spent a few hours together in wonderful witnessing opportunities. I appreciated that the brethren made available on racks some good articles on various topics of interest to the contemporary Christian. At the end I picked one of each and I've been really enjoying them; it makes me more prepared to answer questions the public may ask in the future.

Through this we entered a dialog about God's Plan and also about the Kingdom. We figured out that he was a student of theology. In the conversation he mentioned different philosophies even of the Old Greeks but he told us that he believes that the Bible is God's Holy Word. Sr. Claudia and I talked pretty long with him, sometimes he seemed confused but he had so many questions so that we did not want to break up the conversation.
